2. Students are not permitted to take courses before the required semester, nor are they permitted to register for a course when they have earned a grade less than C-, or have an ABS, INC., etc. in those prerequisite (s) taken in the Department (See Undergraduate Bulletin, 2005-2007 pp. 68-71.)

3. MAJORS IN ACCOUNTING MUST COMPLETE A CONCENTRATION FORM PRIOR TO THEIR DECLARATION OF MAJOR and submit said forms to their Advisor for approval (Forms are available at the Department website.) (See Undergraduate Bulletin, 2005-2007, pp. 69.)

4. Students must earn a C average (2.0) for all courses usable for the major. (See Undergraduate Bulletin, 2005-2007, pp. 69.)

C- requirement does NOT apply to Economics or other approved electives outside the Accounting and Information Systems Department. However, you may NOT P/NC any course that is being used to satisfy your major requirements (including Economics, and Business courses.)

5. NOTE: "English 95 or its equivalent is the minimum (college) co-requisite for all courses" including accounting courses (See Undergraduate Bulletin, 2005-2007, pp.135.)
